Dr Aviva Dautch

Issac Rosenberg is best known for his poems, many written while serving on the Western Front, but he was also a fine painter who exhibited at Whitechapel Gallery. One hundred years after his death, Dr Aviva Dautch asks how an East End Jew became known as "the most remarkable of the British poets killed in the First World War." Dr Dautch is a professor of English Literature at the British Library and Modern Jewish Literature at JW3 and the London School of Studies as well as a widely published poet, critic and essayist.

**Herod's Temple - The Most Magnificent Building in the Roman Empire (20B.C.)**

Dr David Jacobson

Dr Jacobson is an Honorary Research Fellow in the Classics Department at Kings College. He has written widely on different aspects of the history of the ancient Land of Israel, in particular the art, architecture and numismatics of that region. Dr Jacobson has been active in the Palestine Exploration Fund (he was until recently Editor of its flagship journal, PEQ) and in the Anglo-Israel Archaeological Society. He is presently completing a book on Agrippa 11, 20-95 C.E.
